## BACKGROUND


It is well understood that availability of energy per capita is directly related to the growth rate of a society. India is a fast developing country but it also has its share of problems to deal with. It is a country where power outages are the norm, particularly in rural and peri-urban areas. In addition to the power shortage, pollution is another issue that needs to be addressed. The National Solar mission was initiated in 2010 with a vision to take India towards renewable energy in order to meet the power demands as well as address pollution. As of 2016, India has about 10 GWp of solar power installed. The target is to setup 100 GWp of Solar by 2022. This clearly indicates that there is a long way to go in the next 6 years. While large scale power plants are being developed rapidly by means of setting up MW scale solar farms, 40 GWp out of the target of 100 GWp has to be met by means of rooftop solar power. In order to reach this target, efforts have to be made to sensitize people and implement projects in micro levels.

In line with the above, this project aimed at charging up volunteers in urban areas, working in large corporations and giving them an opportunity to make a difference in the lives of people residing in underprivileged areas. The approach was to train the corporate volunteers in the basics of solar energy based systems and then reach out to a nearby rural area with solar home lighting systems. A total of 200 households have been electrified using solar home lighting systems.

## Project Location

Gairatpur Bas is a small village just outside the municipality limits of Gurgaon. It is situated at the foothills of the Aravalis. Electricity is a major problem in the village. Most of the households have an electricity connection however the electricity is available for just 2 hours in the day time and 5 to 6 hours in night time. Only a few houses, not more than 10 have an inverter for power back up. Each house has roughly 1 to 2 fans, 2 to 3 CFL bulb and few houses have a TV set. Typical connected loads in each house is about 1-2 kW and they get an electricity bill of about Rs 500 every alternate month.

These solar home lighting systems save money on energy bills and at the same time sensitize them towards a new technology. Although Gairatpur Bas is remotely located, it is not too far away from CRISIL House, Gurgaon. This ensured ease of access to the employees/volunteers for implementation and monitoring.



## PROJECT ACHIEVEMENT

Advit Foundation with CSR support from CRISIL Foundation undertook the project titled “Co-worker Involvement and Introduction to Renewable Energy and community implementation. The project was initiated in February 2016 wherein 200 houses have been electrified using the solar home lighting systems and more than 1000 community members have been empowered.

- The project consisted of two phases namely, the Co-worker training phase and the field implementation phase. The co-worker training was conducted at CRISIL House, Gurgaon where the participants were trained on the basics of Solar Photovoltaic Technology and Solar Home Lighting Systems. Two sessions were conducted.
- The field implementation was undertaken at village Gairatpur Bas, Sohna Tehsil, Gurgaon District situated at a distance of 20 km from CRISIL House, Gurgaon.
- Solar Home Lighting Systems were setup in 200 households in Gairatpur Bas. The objective was to sensitize the community at the identified site towards the benefits of renewable energy (Solar technology) and empower them to use this technology in their daily lives.

## PROJECT SUMMARY

The project was implemented in two phases:

### 1. Employee training

This was conducted at CRISIL House by Advit trainers. Two sessions were conducted.

The field implementation was also undertaken in three phases

## PROJECT IMPACT

- Direct beneficiaries: More than 1000
- Indirect beneficiaries: More than 3000 considering each direct beneficiary will spread the word about the benefits of this technology to at least 3 more people including people in nearby villages.
- Children get more time to study since lighting is available.
- Residents have lesser exposure to harmful gases released from burning kerosene lamps.
- The community has been sensitized towards solar technology which makes it easier for them to adopt bigger systems like solar water pumps for their fields and solar rooftop power plants. This directly plays a part in aiding the National Solar Mission.
- In most cases, the lighting systems have been issued in the name of the woman of the house, so that they have an asset to their name and get a sense that they have bought this for their house.

A litre of kerosene releases 2.8 kg of CO<sub>2</sub> upon combustion. A typical rural household uses 4-5 litres of kerosene a month. Annually 200 households use around 10,000 litres of kerosene. By using solar lights instead of kerosene lamps, these households would reduce **28 tons of CO<sub>2</sub> emissions annually.**

"The lights are working well and the community is thankful for making these available. The interest levels have increased and people want to understand more about the way solar can be used in more applications in their villages. Nearby villages have also shown interest in these lighting systems."

"I charge these lights using the panel every day. Sometimes when electricity is available, I charge them directly. These work for around 4-5 hours. The children in my house have been able to spend more time with their homework. These lights are fairly bright and are very useful."

## PROJECT SUSTAINABILITY

To ensure that the beneficiaries use the solar lighting system and maintain it, a community contribution has been taken towards the cost of the system. This will ascertain that they don't consider this system as free and have an ownership towards it.

The asset has been issued in the name of the woman of the house. The women have been trained on installing and maintaining these systems.

The local government/panchayat was also involved during the community mobilization and their approval was taken prior to implementation.




